

ZERO WASTE CANDIDATE CITY

REQUIRED CRITERIA

The municipality issues a **public statement/letter** notifying the Mission Zero Academy of their commitment to becoming a Zero Waste Certified City.



The municipality commits to a long-term vision within its zero waste strategy, including:

1. A 90% diversion rate of municipal solid waste (MSW) away from harmful disposal methods and false solutions;

2. A set target (in kgs) of residual waste generated per capita, as per the guidelines provided.



Municipalities with jurisdiction over waste disposal and management decisions commit to:

- Progressively reducing the volume of MSW sent to incineration;

- Neither further investing in nor supporting the development of incineration technologies;

- Stop the expansion of existing incineration capacities within their jurisdiction.

When a municipality does not have the jurisdiction to make decisions over disposal and incineration, they still commit to:

- Progressively reduce the volume of MSW it sends to incineration;

- Work towards and build awareness of sustainable alternative solutions to incineration.



The municipality takes action to increase awareness of zero waste within the community through a diverse range of communication methods.
